Goostrey Neighbourhood Plan

We would like to thank everyone who voted in the Neighbourhood Plan Referendum on 17th August. There was a 97.2% "yes" vote which is the highest in Cheshire East so far. 858 people voted, which represents a 46.4% turnout, the second highest in Cheshire East. The Plan is now "made" and formally adopted by Cheshire East Council as part of the Local Plan which was itself adopted on 27th July. The Neighbourhood Plan will now be used as part of the process to determine all planning applications in Goostrey Parish up until 2030.

Big Anti-Axe Response to Bus Plans

THE 319 BUS UPDATE...There has been no definite news on the future of the 319 Goostrey-Sandbach bus service which is facing withdrawal next year, resulting from proposals to stop subsidising the route. Cheshire East Council wants to cut £1.6 million from the transport budget and the local bus is one of the services picked for the axe. So far the Parish Council has not received the results of the 10-week consultation period for bus users and non-users but the outcome was discussed at the full meeting of the borough council in September. This revealed, according to the Sandbach Chronicle, that 3,900 responded, a record for a consultation, including 400 commenting on the 38 (Crewe-Sandbach-Congleton-Macclesfield) and the 78 (Nantwich-Leighton Hospital-Sandbach-Alsager-Rode Heath-Scholar Green) services. However, no mention was made in the media report of Goostrey and the village's response. The findings highlighted that 76 percent of respondents had no alternative form of transport and 60 percent of people using a route did so at least twice a week. The proposals will be considered at a Cabinet meeting on November 7 with the changes due to come into force after April next year. Meanwhile, local people even if they have their own

Station BridgeUpdate Himalayan Balsam

We have been advised that the work on the bridge scheme is scheduled to take place in 2018. The detailed plan is still in preparation and we will share with you further details of the proposed safety improvements for the Station Bridge as soon as we are able.

We have also asked if we can discuss with Highways possible ways of ensuring that people travelling from Goostrey Station use the Car Park and do not park along Station Road, as has been the practice of some travellers since the Car Park charges have been introduced.

Himalayan Balsam (impatiens glandulifera) is an invasive, non-native, pink flowered species spreading nationally along river banks. It grows 2.5m high and its density crowds out native flora, resulting in a monoculture and causes riverbank erosion increasing the flood risk.



There have been recent sightings of Himalayan Balsam along the river bank in the Bongs.

Goostrey Village Hall Improvements

After the Summer closure the Village Hall Lounge and Main hall are looking great with newly decorated walls and woodwork.



The newly refurbished bar servery kitchen has received very good reviews so far. The new facilities include new stainless steel cupboards and work surfaces, a fast dishwasher, an electric 6 ring range cooker with a large

oven and a full height fridge and a new doorway directly from the bar servery kitchen to the main hall. This enables hirers who just want to use the kitchen the hall to carry on with their event whilst another hirer can use the Lounge.

The kitchen meets the needs of most events included those where caterers are brought in to provide food, so it is less likely that hirers will need to hire the School Kitchen unless their caterer believes that they need the facilities in it.

A lot of people have commented that the bar servery counter spoils the look of the new kitchen as it has not been refurbished. This may be refurbished in future but for the time being we will not be making any more improvements to the kitchen (other than redecorating), until we have received written



feedback from people hiring the new facility. The deadline for feedback is 24th December this year.

Please ensure that any comments you have are with the Parish Clerk by then.

In the meantime we hope that you enjoy using our new kitchen.
