Jodrell Bank awarded UNESCO World Heritage Status

Goostrey Parish Council sends their warmest congratulations to the Jodrell Bank Observatory for achieving the award of UNESCO World Heritage Status. The Lovell Telescope and the control building as well as the SKA global HQ are all in Goostrey Parish and we are very proud to have such a prestigious site so close to our village. The observatory will now be inscribed on the World Heritage List, in recognition of its internationally significant heritage, science and cultural impact. This is incredible news not just for Jodrell Bank, but also for the region, and the UK as a whole. The coveted award marks the culmination of a long journey that began nearly 10 years ago and which has been led tirelessly by Professors Teresa Anderson and Tim O'Brien.

Do you know someone whose voluntary activities make a real contribution to life in Goostrey?

We need your help again to identify the unsung heroes and heroines whose voluntary contributions to our village make it the thriving community it is. Committee Matters

As mentioned on Page I the Parish Council has a committee structure to enable groups of councillors to focus on particular matters of Council business. This reduces the time the Parish Council needs to deliberate on items in the Parish Council Meetings.

The responsibilities of the Committees are as follows:

Planning Committee - Reviews planning applications for Goostrey Parish for which the Parish Council is a consultee. Each application must be on the Agenda of a Planning Meeting so that it can be discussed and a decision made to support, object or comment on an application. The Clerk is then responsible for notifying Cheshire East Planning Department of the decision.

The Planning Committee's decisions are based on the Goostrey Neighbourhood Plan, the Cheshire East Council Local Plan and other national policies.

The Planning Committee also reviews resident's concerns about applications and possible enforcement issues and liaises with Cheshire East Planning Enforcement to resolve these issues.

Finance Committee - Reviews the Council's finances on a quarterly basis. The Clerk in the role of Responsible Financial Officer provides the Committee with the reports and information to check the current status of receipts and payments against the budget for each quarter and prepares the end of year accounts. An internal auditor is appointed each year to check the financial accounts and financial processes of the Council in order to ensure the Council is fulfilling its financial duties and obligations befitting its role as a Parish Council.

The Finance Committee also reviews projects for capital expenditure and oversees the preparation of the budget for the next financial year.

Amenities Committee - Is responsible for maintaining of the graveyard and public areas in the Village. It is also responsible for organizing events such as the Senior Citizen's Lunch, the Parish Council Rose Day Stand etc. The Amenities Committee has responsibility for the Speed Indicator Devices in the Village and the SpeedWatch Group. The Environmental Working Group is a working party of the Amenities Committee. It has membership from the Amenities Committee, local groups and members of the public. It is tasked with improving the environment through local initiatives and reports to the Amenities Committee

New terms of reference have recently been agreed for the Amenities Committee. The terms of reference can be found at <u>https://</u>Goostrey.info/document-category/gov/

Village Hall Management Committee -

this is included as a Council Committee but it is in fact formed specifically for the management of the Village Hall which is a Joint Use Facility. The membership is comprised of Parish Council Members, Village Hall and Playing Field Foundation Members and Offices from the School and Board of Governors.

The Village Hall currently operates at a loss as the running costs for the building and staff exceed the income from the hall lettings. The interest of all parties using the Village Hall need to be considered at all times and managing the building and these relationships is not a simple task but the VHMC assists this process.

Staff Committee - Is responsible for any staff related matters. The majority of these matters confidential which is why the press and public are excluded from most items of business on the agenda of a Staff Committee Meeting.

Annual Report 2018-2019

The Annual Parish Meeting was held in the Village Hall on 18th March 2019 and the Parish Council was pleased to welcome 54 attendees to the meeting.

Chairman's Report

The Chairman delivered his annual report for the year 2018/19.

Achievements

The Chairman reported on a number of achievements so far during the year (which runs from May 2018 to May 2019). These included:

- ♦ A £25,000 donation to the Scout Hut and Youth Centre to enable match-funding and payment of the outstanding loan.
- The Parish Archive Collection has been moved to its new home in the Village Hall Committee Room (see below).
- Support for the Royal British Legion 100th commemoration of the end of World War I and the 18 fallen, including a new oak tree and plaque on the Bog Bean.
- Senior's lunch in November which was attended by over 100 people and annual switching-on of the Christmas Lights organised by the Scouts.
- Congratulations were made to local groups including FOGS for their success in progressing the restoration of the Victorian ticket office at the station.
- And Paul Kemsley for the planting of trees around the village including damson trees near the footpath at Dromedary Lodge.

Highways & SpeedWatch

- Regarding road safety, the Speedwatch group has been restarted by the Parish Council with assistance from the local PCSO and local residents. It will continue to hold speed gun sessions around the village.
- Signage improvements have now been made at the Booth Bed Lane/Hermitage Lane junction with Main Road and it is hoped that work to install traffic lights and a pedestrian footway on the station bridge will take place in the next 12 months.
- Although the Council supported the PTA's initiative to re-introduce a school crossing warden, there have not been any applicants and the position is still vacant.
- There have been various highway maintenance activities during the year most significantly the repair by United Utilities of a sunken drain on Main Road at the end of Bank View.
- All residents are encouraged to report

potholes, street light and other problems on Closing Remarks the Cheshire East Highways website.

Around the Village

- A new Parish Council noticeboard has been installed at the end of Bank View and it is planned to replace all the noticeboards in the village in the near future.
- The last of the village signs has also been installed on Goostrey Lane coming from Twemlow.
- There is now also a new illuminated sign for the Village Hall.
- Thanks to members of the Amenities Committee, all the benches in the village have been restored and planters relocated and replanted. Other improvements at the entrances to the village are currently being planned.

Quality Award

The Council is pleased to have achieved a quality 'Foundation Award' under the Local Council Award Scheme which confirms that the Council is 'operating lawfully and according to standard practice'. Thanks were made to the Parish Clerk for all her work in achieving this award. The Clerk has also been successful in achieving the CiLCA gualification (Certificate in Local Council Administration).

Lastly the Chairman noted that the lodrell Bank Observatory, which is in Goostrey Parish, has now raised the funding for its new First Light gallery (including grants from the Heritage Lottery Fund of £16M and £4M from the UK Government). Jodrell Bank is the UK's current UNESCO World Heritage nomination, which will be decided in July 2019, the Parish Council is represented by the Parish Council Chairman on the Steering Group. It was also noted that the Square Kilometre Array Global HQ has opened at Jodrell Bank following the construction of a new £16M building.

Financial Report

As Chair of the Finance Committee. Councillor lan O'Donoghue presented the financial report for the year which showed that the budget has been met (see Accounts) He also mentioned that there will be a small decrease in the precept paid by each household for the year 2019-2020.

Goostrey Parish Archive

Roger Burgess gave an interesting presentation on the Goostrey Parish Archive (GosPA) including the information that has been provided to relatives of former residents. The Archive group welcomes anyone who would like to join or visit the archive on Tuesdays 2pm to 4pm and Thursdays 10am-12 noon

- Manage a lawn or paddock as a meadow for butterflies & ground nesting birds
- Plant 10 native trees or manage a wood for wildlife

Goostrey Station Bridge

Cheshire East Highways have informed us that they are still working on a suitable design for the scheme, the issue seems to be with the creation of the safe area for pedestrians to cross the Station Bridge.

We are in regular contact with Cheshire East Highways and will share the design with residents as soon as it is released to us.
