Don't miss out on your opportunity to vote in this year's local elections. Make sure that you are registered to vote, you can check this by visiting www.gov.uk/contact-electoral-registration-office or you can register online using this link www.gov.uk/register-to-vote.

For the first time residents in Cheshire East will need to show photographic identification to vote and are being urged to make sure they are ready to vote in May by checking they have an accepted form of ID. Anyone who does not have one of the accepted forms of ID will be able to apply for free online via the gov.uk website or by completing a paper form. The full list of accepted identification is available on the Electoral Commission's website, along with more information about the new requirement and details of how to apply for the free ID, at www.electoralcommission.org.uk/voterID.

Environmental Improvements Project Updates

Shearbrook Bank Environmental Hedging

At the end of December an environmental hedge was planted at the top of Shearbrook Bank. The hedge consists of native, blackthorn-based plants. Weed control fabric has been used to allow the hedge to grow and avoid the need for harmful chemicals.

This type of hedging encourages wildlife by providing a natural habitat and a source of food.

The hedge will take some time to establish itself but should be a welcome addition to the bulbs that were planted on the bank previously.

Boothbed Lane/Main Road Village Entrance

Work has now been completed on this project to enhance the village entrance at Boothbed Lane junction. The area now has additional seating, a new large planter and a bike rack.



Nell's bench is still in pride of place and has been given a clean by the contractors. The painted stones have been placed at the base of the planter so that people can add to them over time if they wish. A 'Manchester Bee' motif on the planter is

also planned.

The style of the benches were chosen to match Nell's bench but, unfortunately, the company who make the benches no longer produces this item in green, although we think that this makes Nell's bench stand out nicely.



The remaining bare areas of grass have been reseeded and the area should look refreshed and beautiful later

on in the year. The Amenities Committee will keep a close eye on the reseeded areas to ensure that the grass grows well and is then maintained properly so that the area continues to look good.

The planter currently contains winter bedding and the council's village maintenance contractors will replace the planting twice a year. The original concrete planters have been relocated to Boothbed Lane Green as they match the existing planters and provide added protection.

Both of these projects were undertaken as a result of the responses provided by residents to the Village Environmental Improvement Plan questionnaire. The Council's Amenities Committee continues to progress the various projects and ideas that this process identified.

Boothbed Lane Play Area Project

The Parish Council's consultation on how to spend the s106 funding closed at the end of February; thank you to everyone who completed the Boothbed Lane Play Area survey, this is an important community project and the feedback we've received is vital in helping the Parish Council to understand what the residents of Goostrey would like to see and how this may be achieved.

The consultation received 79 responses of which 92% felt that the play area should be improved, with 81% wanting a more ambitious project than developing the path around the field. It was fantastic to have 38% of respondents offering to volunteer to be a member of the project team and we will follow this up. Further analysis of the results is needed and there is a long way to go but it's a great start and we can't

Speed Watch Sessions

Thanks go to our three new Speed Watch volunteers who will join Cllr. Rathbone to become the new Speed Watch Team. This means that the Speed Watch Sessions can restart once the new recruits have had their training. Due to some significant changes in personnel within the Neighbourhood Policing Team (for further information please see page 3) the provision of training has been delayed but it is hoped that this will be back on track soon.

The data provided by the SID (Speed Indicator Devices) in the village show that sadly, speeding continues to be a problem and that the presence of the speed Watch Team has proved to be an effective deterrent in the past.

Cheshire East Borough Council Services

In Goostrey, many of the services are provided by the Borough Council rather than the Parish Council and are paid for by your Council Tax. Residents can contact the Borough Council online with any issues. Examples are:

Roads – potholes, white lining, street lighting, gullies, road signs, pavements and other Highways matters. These can be reported by Googling for 'Report IT Cheshire East'.

Bins, waste and recycling – Google for 'Cheshire East Waste'.

Grass verges and weed control Google for 'Cheshire East Grass Verges'

Street Cleansing – fly-tipping, litter, graffiti. Report it by Googling for 'Cheshire East Street Cleansing'.

Environment – noise nuisance (Google 'Cheshire East Noise'), air pollution (email environmentalprotection@cheshireeast.gov.uk)

Planning – enforcement issues. Report suspected breaches of planning or damage to protected trees by Googling for 'Cheshire East Planning Enforcement'.
