You may have noticed that the large concrete planter at the end of Bank View has recently had a makeover. The planter has been painted dark grey/black to give it an updated look and has also now been filled with its summer planting, which should provide a glorious display.

In addition to improving and adding to the street furniture in the village, as resources allow, the Parish Council undertakes a formal review of the condition of its assets each year to ensure their safety and arrange for repairs or replacements as required. This year's annual inspection has just been completed and some work identified which will now be addressed. Highways

The Parish Council continues to try to find a solution to the problem of a short stretch of pavement on Main Road which is being undermined by the roots of a large beech tree. The roots of the tree have damaged the pavement to such an extent that it has become hazardous for pedestrians, especially to young children in pushchairs and less able residents using mobility scooters or wheelchairs. There have been reports of a child on a scooter and a resident on a mobility scooter having been tipped into the road and it is fortunate that these incidents didn't result in serious injury.

The tree is the subject of a Tree Preservation Order and so cannot be removed which in any event is something that the council would wish to avoid. It does, however, remain the case that a suitable resolution needs to be found given the hazard that the pavement poses to pedestrians, the many concerns raised by residents and the level of traffic on this road.

There has been a great deal of work going on behind the scenes, by the Parish Council and Cheshire East Ward Councillor Andrew Kolker, over many months and involving multiple officers and departments at Cheshire East Council with little progress.

In March this year the Parish Council contacted Cheshire East Council and requested that a formal Highways Safety review of the pavement. In May the Parish Council was informed that Main Road is inspected for safety as part of a scheduled inspection regime 3 times per year. An inspection took place during May and it was reported that at that time there were no defects meeting the council's intervention levels at this location. The Parish Council took issue with this and responded robustly.

The matter has now been raised with both The Road Safety Team and The Design Team at Cheshire East Council with a view to widening the pavement and narrowing of the road which would also provide a traffic calming solution. As always, this will depend on the funding available and may take some time – we will keep you updated.

Boothbed Lane Play Area Project Update

Work on the Boothbed Lane Play Area Project continues and a Working Group has been established with oversight by the Amenities Committee and the Parish Council. Cllr. Paul Morgan heads up the small team and additional volunteers, with relevant skills have been identified, from amongst the survey responses, to be invited on to join the group. Thank you to everyone who offered their services. External funding applications have been started with the information available now.

We have received lots of detailed and thoughtful playground designs from Goostrey Primary School children which has given the working group a lot to think about. A big thank you to all the children who took part.

An additional questionnaire is likely to be sent out to help create a prioritised view of what is possible, based on the information from the initial survey. This will provide vital demographic data on the playgrounds users which will assist with grant applications.

We will continue to keep everyone updated via this newsletter, the Parish Magazine and the council's website.

Coronation Celebrations in Goostrey

The Coronation of King Charles III was marked by the and presented each with a mug. He then visited the Parish Council on behalf of residents. A grant was awarded to Jodrell Side WI who, in partnership with Goostrey WI and Goostrey Community Primary School, plan to create a wall hanging to mark the coronation. The work will be carried out by children from the school, members of the WIs and volunteers from the community with the final piece being displayed in the Village Hall as a lasting reminder of the historic event.

On Saturday and Sunday of the Coronation weekend, the beech tree on The Bogbean was lit in gold in celebration of the new King.

The council also purchased enough commemorative mugs to be presented to all the children who attend the village's pre-school and primary School. Cllr. Arthur Freeman visited the pre-school on the morning of 5th May and spoke to the children, who had been learning all about the King and the Coronation

primary school for their afternoon assembly and spoke to the children there, before they were presented with their mugs at the end of the day.





The council ordered additional mugs and will try to present them to any children in the village who are, for example, home schooled or attend school outside of the village. Numbers are limited but if you know of a pre-school or primary school aged child who fit into this category then please contact the Clerk.

However you celebrated the coronation, the Parish Council hopes that you had a wonderful time.

In Goostrey, many of the services are provided by the Borough Council rather than the Parish Council and are paid for by your Council Tax. Residents can contact the Borough Council online with any issues. Examples are:

Roads – potholes, white lining, street lighting, gullies, road signs, pavements and other Highways matters. These can be reported by Googling for 'Report IT Cheshire East'.

Bins, waste and recycling – Google for 'Cheshire East Waste'.

Grass verges and weed control Google for 'Cheshire East Grass Verges'

Street Cleansing – fly-tipping, litter, graffiti. Report it by Googling for 'Cheshire East Street Cleansing'.

Environment – noise nuisance (Google 'Cheshire East Noise'), air pollution (email

environmentalprotection@cheshireeast.gov.uk)

Planning – enforcement issues. Report suspected breaches of planning or damage to protected trees by Googling for 'Cheshire East Planning Enforcement'.
