Highways Liaison Meetings

Following the election in May, the council decided to appoint a councillor as Highways Liaison to, amongst other things, attend liaison meetings, assist the Clerk in progressing highways issues and priorities and advance all opportunities to get Goostrey's needs on any existing and future Highways programmes of work. An extremely positive meeting has taken place with the local Highways Officer and a second meeting has already been scheduled. Whilst this doesn't mean that all of the village's highways problems will be resolved immediately, it does hopefully mean that the Highways team are clear on our priorities. For example, while the signage at the Bomish/Cross Lane crossroads has been re-instated, the road markings have not and the Officer is going to progress this. In addition it was confirmed that the Officer would pursue re-lining work to improve the Boothbed/Main Road junction. The online tool is easy to use and problems can be reported at any time, it's also possible to see any recently reported problems and if you provide an email address, you will receive updates on the status of your report.

Amenities Committee—Christmas Lights

Work has continued throughout the year, via the Amenities Committee, to improve the Christmas lighting on The Bogbean. Additional funding for this project was approved by the council so that a professional lighting company could be brought in to offer their expertise and install the new lighting. The beech tree's trunk and lower branches will be wrapped with professional grade, warm white, LED pea-lights and the existing floodlights will be replaced with two uplighters positioned at the base of the trunk so that the light shines up through the branches.

On the advice of the lighting company, the larch tree will not be dressed as it was felt that the branches are now too delicate so the committee has purchased an additional large, warm white lighting decoration. Work is being undertaken to establish a connection to the electricity for the new decoration and to make sure that everything is in place for the light switch on event on 26th November.

The Amenities Committee will review the lighting provision again in the new year to establish whether further work is required and if additional funding will be required.

Most of the Capital and Non-Capital (Revenue) reserves are earmarked, this includes maintenance payments to Cheshire East Council for the Village Hall Recharge. The Recharge is budgeted in the year required and spent in the following year. Due to administrative issues at Cheshire East the council has not been invoiced for the Recharge for several years. Funds are also held in reserves for projects and improvements. The Parish Council must also ensure that it holds sufficient reserves to cover the costs in the event of a by-election and to continue to run the council should there be a disruption to its income.

Tree Warden Required

Thelma Carter has decided to step down from her role as Tree Warden and the council would like to take this opportunity to thank her for her hard work over the last four and a half years in this important voluntary role.

Trees are important because they provide a habitat for wildlife, shade and shelter and are appreciated by people for their beauty and the sense of wellbeing they bring. Would you be interested in being a contact and support for all things tree related in the village?

Tree Wardens are not expected to be experts in

tree matters but rather help to keep the Parish Council advised of any concerns regarding;

- the removal or mistreatment of trees with Tree Protection Orders on them,
- the replacement of trees with Tree Protection Orders on them which have been removed
- trees which merit having a Tree Protection Order on them,
- Sign posting people to the correct service.

Goostrey Playground Community Project

The Goostrey Playground Community Project team continue to work with Cheshire East Council and Ansa who will deliver the project to improve the Booth Bed Lane Play Area. The team of volunteers meets regularly and is progressing grant applications and obtaining indicative quotes for play equipment.

New Benches

Following its annual review of parish council owned assets three benches were identified as needing to be replaced, they are the bench on The Bogbean facing Main Road and the two rustic style benches at the rear of Booth Bed Lane Green. One of these benches has a memorial plaque attached, this will be retained and re-instated on the new bench.

Post Office Outreach Service

You may be aware that the Post Office has been looking for a new home following the passing of Goostrey's own Mrs Kettle. The Parish Council views the Post Office Outreach service in Goostrey as vital for our rural community and has been keen to offer whatever support it can to ensure that it can be retained in the village.

Goostrey Methodist Church has done a fantastic job in finding the Post Office a new home on its premises, and is in the process of funding the work to make the new service accessible and securing the necessary permission for change of use. At its meeting in October, the Parish Council voted unanimously to provide a grant of £1,800 as a contribution towards the architects fees. Well done to everyone at Goostrey Methodist Church for their hard work so far.

Cheshire Fast

In Goostrey, many of the services are provided by the Borough Council rather than the Parish Council and are paid for by your Council Tax. Residents can contact the Borough Council online with any issues. Examples are:

Roads – potholes, white lining, street lighting, gullies, road signs, pavements and other Highways matters. These can be reported by Googling for 'Report IT Cheshire East'.

Bins, waste and recycling – Google for 'Cheshire East Waste'.

Grass verges and weed control Google for 'Cheshire East Grass Verges'

Street Cleansing – fly-tipping, litter, graffiti. Report it by Googling for 'Cheshire East Street Cleansing'.

Environment – noise nuisance (Google 'Cheshire East Noise'), air pollution (email

environmentalprotection@cheshireeast.gov.uk)

Planning – enforcement issues. Report suspected breaches of planning or damage to protected trees by Googling for 'Cheshire East Planning Enforcement'.
