Non Designated Heritage Assets

Local Heritage Assets in Goostrey Parish	Notes	
Bowl Barrow, SW of Jodrell Bank Farm	This is in addition to the neighbouring tumulus which is a Scheduled Ancient Monument. 2400-1500BC.	
Holly Bank Farm, Main Road	Appears on Greenwood's map dated 1819	
Dromedary Lodge, off Main Road	Constructed 1881 but some of the origina brickwork is from the earlier mid 17 th Century farmhouse.	
The Crown Inn Public House, Main Road	Occupancy dates back to the 16 th Century. Built as a farmhouse in 1680. It became a pub in the 17 th Century and was called 'The Mainwaring Arms' until 1880.	
The Red Lion Public House, Station Road	Built in the early 18 th Century, said to have been occupied at least since 1711.	
Bridge Farm, Blackden	17 th Century.	
Corn Mill, Mill Lane	There has been a watermill on the site since the 14 th Century.	
Wood End Farm	Early 18 th Century.	
Shawcroft Hall Farm	SW face is brick, but the back is black and white timbered.	
Mill House, Mill Lane	18 th Century.	
Bridge House, Blackden Lane	A timber-framed house encased in brick during the 19 th Century. Some of the interior walls are still wattle and daub. Possibly dating back to 1650 or earlier in the Elizabethan era. Former Wesleyan Meeting House.	
Station Houses, Station Road	Built in 1890's for railway staff.	
Bog Bean Cottage, Main Road	Previously Buckbean Pit Farm, 1645.	
Forge Cottage, Church Bank	Blacksmith's cottage, early 17th century
